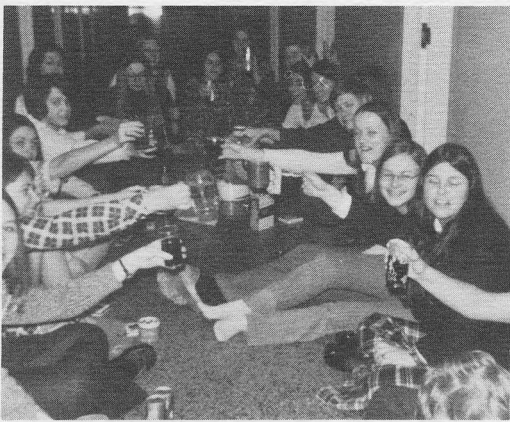


DEDICATION

EDITOR'S MESSAGE

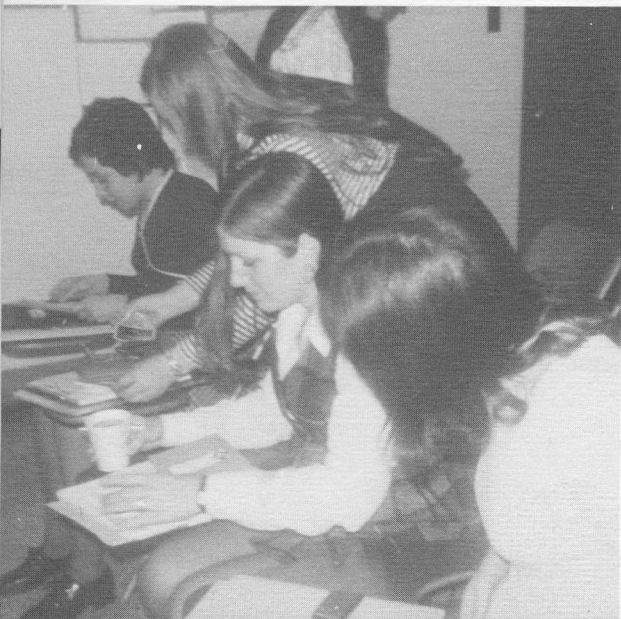
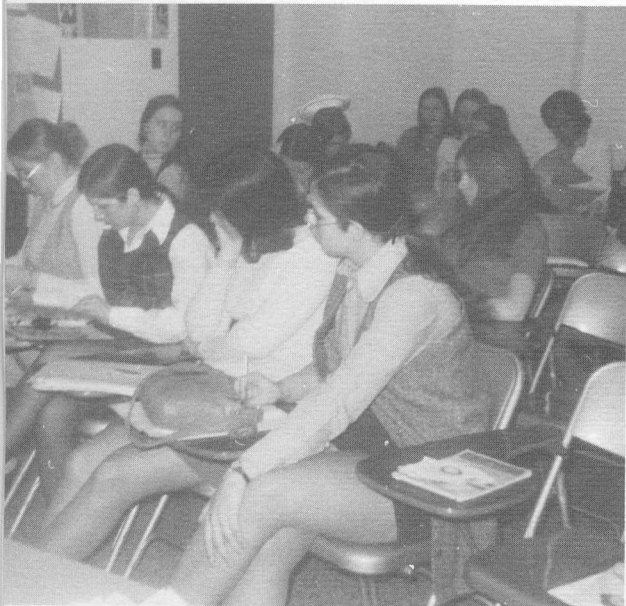
