Our Purpose



Inclusion and Reconciliation	Deepen our dialogue and focused action with our sponsored organizations in creating culturally safe environments of care for Indigenous Peoples and advancing Truth & Reconciliation Calls to Action.
Ecology and Laudato Si'	Mobilize Catholic health in support of Laudato Si', with an integrative approach—including Indigenous leadership to connect land, health, and spirituality in our work as Catholic health.
Community Engagement	Engage the people of Catholic health in community around strategic priorities and goals and explore a "peer exchange" approach.
Pan-Canadian Collaborative	Advance the "Pan-Canadian Collaborative for Catholic Health Ethics, Formation and Mission Integration" to increase collaboration amongst sponsors and address gaps in service to sponsored works.
Holy See Relations	In partnership with the Catholic Health Association of the United States, continue to build relationship with the Holy See, and provide leadership in the Catholic sponsorship model.
